Raymond Jay Fisher was born and raised in Baltimore. He graduated from Baltimore City College and later received a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Baltimore.

Upon graduation, he joined the Baltimore Police Department where he rose to the rank of detective lieutenant before retiring

after 32 years of service. During his time with Baltimore City, Jay earned numerous commendations and awards, served six years in the Executive Protection Unit for Mayor William Donald Schaefer, and retired as operations commander of the Warrant Apprehension Task Force, the nationally acclaimed unit responsible for serving violent felony warrants throughout Maryland.

Jay successfully ran for Baltimore County Sheriff in 2002 and is serving in his fifth term. He is an active member of the Maryland Sheriffs' Association, serving as president in 2008 and 2015; the Maryland Sheriffs' Institute, serving as president in 2006; the National Sheriffs' Institute, the Major Counties Sheriffs' Association, and the Maryland Chiefs of Police As-

sociation. He serves on the boards of the National Sherrif's Association, Homeland Security Committee, Courthouse Security, Service of Process, and Prisoner Transportation Committee. He is also the longest serving Sheriff since 1687.

Jay began his Masonic affiliation in 1973 when he joined his father and uncle's Blue Lodge, Liberty-Pickering Lodge #219. When he became a member of Boumi in 1974, he joined the Provost Guard. He is also a member of the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry.

Jay was appointed to the Divan in 2016. He is a plural member of Crescent Lodge #240, and a member of the Motor Corps, and the Ambassadors, as well as several other clubs and units at Boumi.





IN MEMORIAM

Illustrious Sir John L. Charlton Jr., P.P. March 20, 1931 - October 21, 2021



Boumi Shriners Potentate 1979

Tllustrious Sir Jack Charlton, Jr. passed **▲** away on October 21, 2021. He was born March 20, 1931 in Baltimore, Maryland, the only child of Noble John L. Charlton and Mildred Pierson Charlton. He had a strong Boumi heritage which went back three generations to his Grandfather George W. H. Pierson, one of Boumi's early founders.

Ill. Sir Jack graduated from Baltimore Polytechnic Institute in 1949, received his pre-medical training at Washington College in Chestertown, MD and medical training from Temple University School of Podiatry, Philadelphia, PA. After his graduation in 1955, he served an internship at University of Pennsylvania and Philadelphia General Hospitals whereupon Uncle Sam entered the picture and Ill. Sir Jack was requested to serve.

He joined the Maryland National Guard, Medical Detachment to the 110th and 224th Field Artillery, Pikesville, MD, but was called to active duty during the Korean Conflict. He was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division to attend the foot ills of paratroopers.

Later in his career he was sent to Walter Reed General Hospital as Chief of the Podiatry Clinic, Orthopedic Service, where he remained for six years. He was President of the Military Association of Podiatrists. It was during this time that

Captain Charlton was delegated as White House Podiatrist and attended personally to President and Mrs. Dwight D. Eisenhower and many other outstanding military leaders.

Ill. Sir Jack was raised to the degree of Master Mason in Alamo Lodge No. 44 in San Antonio, TX in December 1963. He was a Scottish Rite Mason and was active in Boumi as President of the Towson Shrine Club and served as Vice President of the Scimeter Club. He was appointed Marshal by Ill. Sir J. Calvin Smyth, P.P. He was appointed Ambassador by Ill. Sir Robert Phelps, P.P. and an Aide by Ill. Sir Max Armor, P.P. He was made Honorary President by the Scimeter Club in 1973 and Honorary Boumi Clown in 1975. Ill. Sir Jack was appointed by Imperial Potentate Warren Wech as Aide to the Imperial Marshal.

On June 29, 1953 Jack married the former Gloria Lambdin. They had two sons: Dean Pierson Charlton and John Luther Charlton III (Wendy) and two grandsons: J. Luke Charlton and Garrett L. Charlton.
