"One last thing Wayne. If all your friends haven't already got those reservations in to the Recorder's Office for the Imperial Convention July 2-6, do it now."





Shriners Hospitals for Children: A History of Innovation and Excellence in Burn Care

Shriners Hospitals for Children® is noted worldwide as a leader in pediatric burn care. Since opening our three pediatric burn hospitals in the 1960s, our health care system has been at the forefront of innovative programs and treatment techniques that have both dramatically improved the survival rate for children with severe burns and enhanced their quality of life. Here is a brief look at our work over the decades:

1960s

The governing body of the Shriners organization passed a resolution at the Imperial Session in 1962 to build and operate hospitals specializing in pediatric burn care. The first hospital opened in 1962 in Galveston, Texas, followed by additional specialized hospitals in Cincinnati, Ohio, and Boston, Massachusetts two years later.

1970s

Tremendous improvements in survival rates were made, particularly because of innovative research in excision, grafting and intravenous feeding. In addition, pressure garments that helped lessen scarring were developed. Shriners Hospitals for Children — Cincinnati pioneered skin banking – a precursor to future methods of tissue, bone and skin procurement. In addition, Shriners Hospitals for Children worked with the United States Fire Administration and Consumer Product Safety Commission to identify burn prevention programs for schools and fire departments. And, our Boston hospital began the first school re-entry program.

1980s

Outpatient clinics were added to provide continued care for patients after they have been discharged from the hospital. Also, researchers at Shriners Hospitals for Children discovered that early surgical excision and grafting reduces infections, shortens hospital stays and improves cosmetic outcomes for patients. Finally, Burn Awareness Week, a national education campaign, was created in an effort to raise public awareness and reduce the number of burn injuries in children.

1990s

Care was made available for non-burn conditions such as port wine stains, congenital ear deformities and other complex wound and skin conditions. In addition, new programs were set up to help burn patients with psychological and social issues, including transitioning back to school and community. In 1996, Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston collaborated with the American Burn Association to develop an outcome



instrument to measure functional outcomes in pediatric burn survivors. And, in 1997, Shriners Hospitals for Children — Northern California opened in Sacramento and soon became the busiest pediatric burn center in the Western U.S.

2000s

The hospitals in Boston and Cincinnati received the Press Ganey Summit Award for extraordinary patient satisfaction. All four of the hospitals were recognized as leaders in the field of burn care, with each hospital maintaining a leadership position with the American Burn Association. Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston, through microfluidics research, developed a micro-chip device that aids therapeutic strategies for burn patients.

2010s

In 2011, Shriners Hospitals for Children — Northern California hosted its first Regional Burn Conference, a continuing education program for physicians, nurses, first responders, therapists and other health care professionals. In 2014, David Herndon, M.D., Shriners Hospitals for Children - Galveston chief of staff, was awarded the Medallion for Scientific Achievement by the American Surgical Association and the Tanner-Vanderput-Boswick Burn Prize from the International Society for Burn Injuries. John Burke, M.D., former chief of staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children - Boston, was inducted into the Inventors Hall of Fame posthumously in 2015 for his work with the invention of artificial skin. Also, Shriners Hospitals for Children achieved amazing results using CO2 fractional laser therapy to help heal burn scars.



Albion Kenneth Hutcherson, P.P. September 26, 1923 - February 2, 2023

Ill. Sir A. Kenneth Hutcherson passed away on February 2, 2023 at the age of 99. Born September 26, 1923 in Pittsylvania County, VA, Ken was the second oldest son of Jesse Martin Hutcherson and Evelyn Starkey Hutcherson. He was predeceased in death by his wife of 67 years, Virginia Kirsch Hutcherson in 2015. Ken was the devoted father of Stephen Kent Hutcherson of Boca Raton, FL and Kimberly Anne Hutcherson of Rockville, MD.

After high school graduation in Halifax, VA, Ken moved to Baltimore, MD and worked for the Glen L. Martin Company before enlisting in the Army Air Corps in 1942. As a technical sergeant during World War II, he flew 26 missions on a B-17 Flying Fortress as a radio operator/gunner and bombardier in the 8th Air Force, 95th bomb group, 335th squadron in Horham, England. Ken was honorably discharged in October 1945 and was a member of the Air Force reserves until May, 1953. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal with three clusters, three Presidential Distinguished Unit Citations and was inducted into the Chevalier Legion of Honor from France in 2014.

Ken worked in the printing industry throughout his career. After he returned home, he attended Marietta College in Ohio for one semester, but soon returned to Baltimore and accepted employment with the Lord Baltimore Press. He also continued his education by attending McCoy College and the University of Baltimore. In 1956, he went to work for Dulany-Vernav Company as a printing salesman, and then to Vari-Typer Corpo-

ration for three years. In 1960 Ken joined Modern Linotypers, Inc., and was a vice president with that firm. After leaving Modern Linotypers as a Vice President, he became Chief of Graphics at the International Monetary Fund in Washington, DC until he retired at age 65. Ken continued to work once a week at a Hunt Valley post office until covid struck in 2020.

In 1952, Ken received his third degree in Tuscan Lodge No. 202 and in 1964 he served as Worshipful Master. He received his 32nd degree in the Scottish Rite in 1965 and recieved the KCCH in 2021, and he became a member of Boumi Temple in 1966. He was appointed to the Divan by Past Potentate C. R. (Chick) Zarfoss, serving as Potentate in 1974.Ken was also a member of the Royal Order of Jesters, Jamestown Society, American Legion, and the VFW.

In addition to his parents and wife, Ken was preceded in death by his brothers, Jesse, James, Cecil, and Richard. He is survived by his youngest brother, Robert of Laurens, SC. and many nieces and nephews.


