



"Okay, if we win who gets the money?"


"Good question Tommy. Well, lets win the money first."



First, Boumi for suppling the equipment and funds to transport our Kids. Plus, all you Nobles and friends for raising money for the Transportation Fund. The Hospital Staff for making our job easier and especially the drivers, who are willing to get up in the wee hours of the morning to transport our deserving kids with their parents.

In 2023, the Boumi Shepherds made 48 trips for just the Local Area. That's about 10,800 Miles! AND this does not include the Eastern Shore Shepherds, Chester River Shepherds, or Southern Maryland Shepherds. Which would more than double the miles. Plus, it does not include the kids transported from Western MD by the Ali Gahn Shepherds. Mystery Party that Boumi is hosting for the Jobies, DeMolay, and Rainbow in February. Our Grand Bethel has thrown a few and they have been well received by all who attend.

In DelMar Job's Daughters we celebrate the New Year with new Daughter Representatives. On December 2nd, at the Scottish Rite in Baltimore, our new Misses were crowned. Miss Willa T. was crowned Miss Junior Jobie, Miss Kylee P., the Grand Bethel Honored Queen, was crowned Miss Congeniality, and Miss Brianna T. was crowned Miss Job's Daughter of DelMar.

January in Jobies much like other Masonic Family Organizations, means installation season. All Bethels across Maryland and Delaware will be preparing for the new terms. Jobie terms last six months, we have installations in January and June. This allows Daughters the opportunity to hold more offices during their time in the organization. If a girl were to join when she turns 10, she would have 20 terms to have a chance to take all 19 offices during her 10 years in the organization.

Starting at the bottom and working our way to the top we have 19 offices in a full bethel, but only the top 5 are progressive. Any Daughter can hold any other of the 14 offices at any point. At the beginning we have the Outer and Inner Guards, they guard our anteroom door during the meetings. The Junior and Senior Custodians assist in setting up and tearing down the bethel room paraphernalia and assist their coordinating princess during initiation. We have 5 Messenger positions in Jobies. The 1st and 2nd Messengers begin the story Miss Job's Daughter Brianna Tackett of Job's life during initiation, the 3rd and 4th Messengers finish the story of Job's life during initiation, and the 5th Messenger wraps up the story and ties it to the organization.

Our Librarian provides a report at each meeting which could be playing a song, reading a poem, sharing scientific facts, or anything relating to literature, art, and science. The Musician plays an instrument, cd player, or mp3 player during all the musical parts of bethel meetings. The Recorder, much like a Lodge Secretary or Shrine Recorder, is responsible for taking & reading meeting minutes, keeping track of money with the treasurer, reading communications, and taking roll. Our Treasurer, again like a Lodge or Shrine Treasurer, is responsible for keeping track of the bethel monies. Finally, the last of the 14 non-progressive stations is the Chaplain. Like a Lodge or Shrine Chaplain, this Daughter leads all prayers said in the meeting. She also communicates the Pledge of Honor for Adults who have never attended a Bethel meeting and the Obligation to the new members during the initiation.

Our progressive line, the top 5 officers in the Bethel, requires that Daughters satisfactorily pass their proficiency examination before they take one of these stations. Beginning at the bottom is the Marshal, she is seated in the West and presents the flag of the US (or the country in which the bethel is located), is responsible for setting up and tearing down bethel paraphernalia, and assists the Guide. The Guide is next, also seated in the West. She escorts guests and visitors when called upon, leads new members through initiation, and in some bethels coordinates a service project for the term. Moving into the East we start with the Princesses, similar to the Wardens in a lodge. The Junior Princess teaches the 1st set of lessons during initiation and in some bethels is responsible for a fundraising project during the term. The Senior Princess teaches the 2nd set of lessons during initiation and in some bethels is responsible for a promotional activity or project. Finally, the Honored Queen. Much like a Potentate or Worshipful Master, she is responsible for planning a term calendar to include meetings, required events, and fun events. She presides over all bethel meetings and activities and teaches the final lessons during initiation. We hope you found this article informative and we hope to see you at your local Bethel's meeting or Installation in the new year!




