From the Desk of the Recorder-Elect



“Lots of fun and big prizes and food too.”




In Blue Lodge, Past Master Jewels should be returned to the lodge. All our Masonic Paraphernalia, unless there is a Mason or Noble in the family, should be returned, and as always let someone know where your apron is!

My wife and I took off the week after Christmas, December is a busy month for me as a church man. We traveled to Williamsburg, met and ate with friends, and reminisced about our first time there with PGM Steven Ponzillo. We celebrated St. John's day at the Masonic Temple and attended church services at Bruton Parish as we do every year. On my Sundays off I still try to attend church where all I have to do is worship, not lead.

January is installation month. You should try your best to attend at least one, if not your own lodge's. Think back to when your journey started, so that you might consider how best it is going to end. Life requires planning, so Brothers from the beginning to the end may you and your families enjoy a healthy and happy New Year. Take care, stay safe, and God Bless.


In November, I had the absolute pleasure of attending Boumi's Hospital Night for the first time. It




