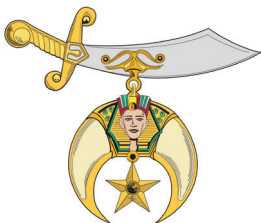

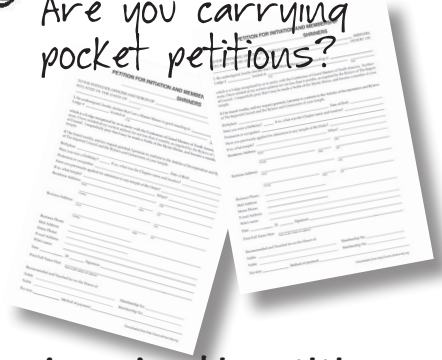

**G**reetings my fellow Nobles and Ladies of Boumi Temple.

It is late July as I write this to you. We have been to Charlotte for Imperial Session and have returned ready to work even harder for you. Unfortunately, the membership at Charlotte voted to increase the per capita to the membership by \$20.00. This is down from the \$30.00 that Imperial was asking for. So, what this means to you is our next dues will go up by \$20.00. \$50.00 per capita, \$5.00 hospital tax, and \$55.00 Boumi dues for a grand total of \$110.00 total per member.

My suggestion to you, if you are able, is to purchase a Per Capita Life Membership at the current cost of \$900. (\$30.00 per

capita times 30 years is \$900.) This can be purchased at this rate until December 15, 2023. This would effectively reduce the number of years to 18 years (\$900.00 /\$50 = 18years) This purchase would eliminate you from any future Per Capita Increase.

As of January 1, 2024, the cost of a Per Capita Life Membership will increase to \$1500.00.

If you have any questions about per capita increases or life memberships, please contact the office at 410-391-6400 and the Recorder and office staff will help you with this.

By the time this arrives in your mailboxes the the Baird (Beer) Brigade at the Maryland State Fair will be winding down. We should also be having a great time MASA at Virginia Beach. The Haunted House is right around the corner in October. Around Thanksgiving the FEZtival of Trees will be kicking off. See Randy Dietrich to sign up to help.

We have a trip to Sight and Sound theater in November for their Christmas Show. The Stag Bull and Oyster Roast in December is also fast approaching.

"Don't forget the last day of the Haunted House, October 29th, is Trunk-or-Treat at 5. The kids love that one!"

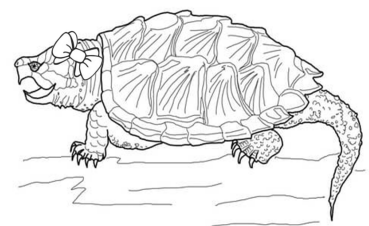
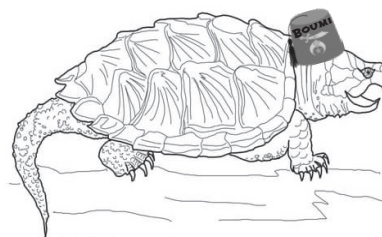
Gertie Goose looked over and said, "remind everyone to check all the ads for the dates and info!"

## Special Notice of Per Capita Dues Increase

At the recent Imperial Session in Charlotte, NC an **increase in the Per Capita Tax portion of your dues was approved**. Starting with the 2024 dues, which you will receive in September, your total dues will **increase by \$20.00** unless you are a Per Capita Life member.

The current Per Capita Tax is \$30.00. As of January 1, 2024, it will increase to \$50.00.

You can purchase a Per Capita Life Membership at the current cost of \$900.00 (\$30 X 30 years) until December 15, 2023. This would effectively reduce the number of years to 18 years (\$900.00 / \$50 = 18 years). Purchase would also eliminate you from any future Per Capita increases.

As of January 1, 2024, the cost of Per Capita Life Membership will increase to \$1,500.00.

Beginning in 2023,  
 Imperial will no longer be issuing stickers for your dues card to confirm that your dues are paid.

They will be issuing new digital dues cards only available online or on smart phone apps, called My FezCard Viewer, available for both iPhones and Androids.

## How to Download and Use My FezCard Viewer

### Download My FezCard Viewer – iPhone

1. Open the App Store on your phone.
2. Search for “My FezCard Viewer” and click on the icon.
3. Click the “Install” button to install My FezCard Viewer.

### Download My FezCard Viewer – Android

1. Open the Google Play Store on your phone.
2. Search for “My FezCard Viewer” and click on the icon.
3. Click the “Install” button to install My FezCard Viewer.

### Using My FezCard Viewer

1. Open My FezCard Viewer. Enter your Shrine ID and Last Name. Type your Temple Name and click on it to highlight it as below. Click the “REGISTER” button at the bottom. You will only need to register the first time you open the app.



2. At the bottom of the screen, you will have two options: Shrine Card and QR Code. The screenshot below shows the Shrine Card option.



3. You can click “QR Code” at the bottom or swipe the screen to the left to view the QR Code for easy scanning at Temple events and functions.



### Using My FezCard Viewer



## Imperial Travels

It gives me great honor to continue to travel around Shrinedom sporting my Boumi Fez, representing all of you, sharing how great a temple we have, and how enthusiastic each and every one of you are as hard-working Shrine-Masons.

In July at the 149th Imperial Session in Charlotte, NC I was honored to be nominated by our Potentate, Robert Creech, and elected to the next chair in Imperial Divan and I'm now honored to serve as your Imperial Oriental Guide. This is a big jump in the Imperial Divan as it represents going from the "top of the bottom to the bottom of the top", referring to where you are in the imperial line. What this also means is, we are now "on the clock" to make the selection and announcement of where we will be hosting the Imperial Session in 2028. It is also time to start putting our team together of those who will be sharing the opportunities and hard work in running the 154th Imperial Session.

Since the Imperial Session we have been busy working for the Fraternity and Philanthropy. I now serve as the liaison to the Shriners Children's burn hospital in Boston, continue to serve as the chairman of the building and equipment committee, vice-chairman of the Shriners Children's Open, a member of the corporate compliance committee, and now as a member of the Philanthropy and MarCom committees.

I have also been appointed to serve as the Chairperson of the Shriners International DeMolay Committee which will be transitioned into a committee with a goal of discovering new ways Shriners can be involved supporting all the Masonic youth groups. These young people will continue to be our future members. They may also be the parents of children who may someday need our care, and they will know what incredibly high-quality care their child would receive at our hospitals because of the involvement they have had as a member of a Masonic Youth group.

At the joint board leadership workshop, which included a trip to your Portland Hospital, we learned we are expanding to four more clinics in our system. Yes, our system continues to grow! The old elevator speech about us being 22 hospitals is no longer the case, we are now providing care in nearly 100 locations with more opening. By the end of 2023 you will have two additional clinics in Mexico and an additional one opening in the first quarter of 2024. When the third clinic opens in early next year that will bring to a total of five full time clinics in Mexico. These new and exist-

ing clinics are putting in place the Shriners Hospitals for Children's Vision 2035 - to provide more care to more kids in more places, closer to home, with less of a draw on the endowment.

We will also be looking at an expansion to the Mexico City hospital to include an ambulatory surgery center to increase the capacity of that hospital to treat more of the kids in South and Central America. We are also expanding our footprint in Canada with additional clinics. We are not just growing internationally, but in the U.S. as well. Your Philadelphia Hospital has a clinic in Doylestown, PA. We now have affiliations with the Medical University of South Carolina, Boys Town, Blank Children's Hospital in North Dakota and this is just a small portion of the list of how your healthcare system is growing.

As the summer turned to fall, we attended, and represented you, at the Central States Shrine Association in Omaha, Nebraska and look forward to seeing so many of you at MASA in Virginia Beach.

Shriners Children's continues to use sports as a way to promote the philanthropy. Our PGA event in October continues to be a launching pad for some of the PGA's top players at the beginning of the new season. Our past winners include Tiger Woods and Patrick Cantlay who both prized their win at Shriners Open as their first PGA tour victory and the start of incredible careers. This year we signed a contract with ESPN to sponsor a women's collegiate softball event; a chance to reach into women's sports and better reach their audience which includes potential donors and the parents of our potential patients. We also continued our relationship with NASCAR sponsoring the Spring race at Darlington and, in August, the Shriners' Children's 200 in Watkins Glen, NY.

All these sporting events allow us to bring in donors and potential donors, let them meet our international patient ambassadors, and have conversations with us about how they can help by donating to your healthcare system. These events also get the name and image of Shriners Hospitals on TV.

As I started, it is a great pleasure to be a Maryland Shrine-Mason and especially a member of Boumi. I am honored to serve as an Imperial officer and, as always, stand ready to answer any questions about your fraternity and your healthcare system or to speak at any unit or club about what is happening and how you are making children's lives better every day.

# INTRODUCING OUR 2023-2024 INTERNATIONAL PATIENT AMBASSADORS:

## MEET GIANNA AND JUAN DIEGO



Every year, Shriners Children's™ selects a pair of International Patient Ambassadors to represent the healthcare system's patients. The ambassadors share their stories of perseverance and the ways Shriners Children's has made a difference in their lives. We are honored to have these impressive young people advocating for our healthcare system.

### GIANNA

Gianna, 15, was born with a rare condition called proximal femoral focal deficiency (PFFD), which caused her to be missing part of her left femur. Her parents knew they had to find the right specialized care for their daughter, and were grateful to learn that the orthopedic team at Shriners Children's Southern California had the expertise to treat PFFD.

Gianna's left leg was shorter than her right one, and she faced hip malformations and other congenital left extremity limb deficiencies, said Robert Cho, M.D., pediatric orthopedic surgeon and chief of staff at Shriners Children's Southern California. "Gianna did not have a functional knee joint, and she had a non-functioning foot that was pointed inward. It would have been essentially impossible for her to walk without amputating that and giving her a prosthesis," Dr. Cho said.

Gianna had her first visit at Shriners Children's when she was 3 months old, and at 9 months, she received her first prosthesis.

As Gianna grew older she became aware of her physical differences and at times struggled with her self-image. With the unwavering love and support of her family and her care team at Shriners Children's, she developed

the confidence to embrace life. The prosthetics and rehabilitation teams worked with Gianna to teach her how to adapt and build the skills to meet her physical challenges.

*"My Shriners Children's family taught me to never let my leg hold me back from being the best version of myself," she said.*

Now Gianna is an active high school student who is both an artist and an athlete. She is an avid sports fan and keeps busy by competing in tennis and golf. She especially loves football, and her favorite team is the Kansas City Chiefs. Her dream is to be the commissioner of the NFL someday. With her drive and spirit, Dr. Cho has every confidence that Gianna can achieve what she sets her mind to.

Gianna's father was so impressed with the care his daughter received he was inspired to become a Shriner and currently serves as chairman of the Board of Governors at Shriners Children's Southern California. "I'm so proud of my dad. I'm glad that he has found a brotherhood and a community. Just as I have found support, he has, as well," said Gianna.

"Shriners Children's was there for me when I needed them," said Gianna. "I wouldn't be where I am today without them. Being an International Patient Ambassador gives me the opportunity to show my gratitude for Shriners Children's. I want to inspire and encourage kids just like me and let them know that the limits are endless. All they have to do is try!"

## JUAN DIEGO

Juan Diego, 18, was burned in an electrical accident when he was 13, leaving his hands seriously disfigured. He spent more than a month in the hospital in Honduras. When he returned home, he was completely dependent on others for even the most basic tasks. He could not take care of himself, go to school, or draw or play music, two of his passions.

The Ruth Paz Foundation, a non-profit organization in Honduras devoted to providing quality medical services to children, learned about Juan Diego's burn injury and connected him with Shriners Children's Boston. Four months after his injury, he arrived at the hospital in Boston. Some of his burn wounds were still open, requiring immediate attention from the acute burn team. Juan Diego knew the road ahead was going to be challenging, but he approached every day, every treatment and every obstacle with a positive attitude.

During his two and a half months in Boston in 2018, much of Juan Diego's treatment involved intensive physical and occupational therapy. He worked with therapists at least five days a week, sometimes multiple times a day. Occupational therapist Courtney Updegrave fabricated customized splints for his hands, enabling Juan Diego to relearn how to care for himself. He was even able to draw and play the drums again.

Along with his traditional therapy sessions, Juan Diego was a member of Team Brave, the hospital's community reintegration program and competed in a Spartan Race as part of Team No Limits. He was also one of five patients who attended Game 1 of the World Series. He says it is a night he will never forget.



Juan Diego transferred to the reconstructive phase of his care where Joseph Upton, M.D., a plastic surgeon hand specialist, was able to restore sensation and mobility by taking tissue from another part of Juan Diego's body and building a web space between his thumb and index finger. Juan Diego continues to come to Shriners Children's Boston for reconstructive and laser surgeries to improve the function and mobility of his hands.

With every improvement, Juan Diego is able to do more of what he loves. From art and music to so many sports - soccer, football, tennis and ping-pong, Juan Diego keeps very busy. He would even love to go to the Paralympics to compete in ping-pong someday. "I should probably start practicing!" he laughed.

Now a college student in Honduras studying international relations, Juan Diego is honored to represent Shriners Children's as an international patient ambassador.

*"I want to put into action all of the gratitude I have for Shriners Children's and those who have helped me since my injury," he said. "I hope my story brings inspiration and hope to others."*



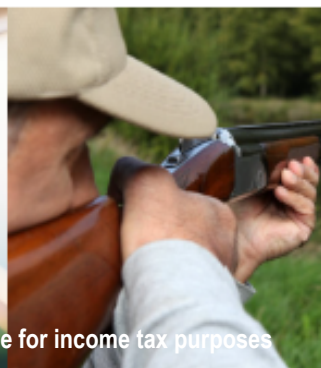
