

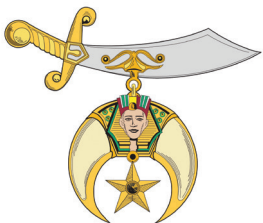

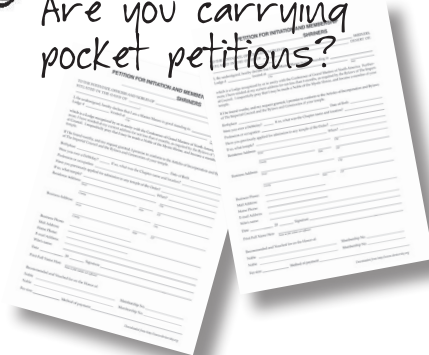

"No, you don't have to worry about that."

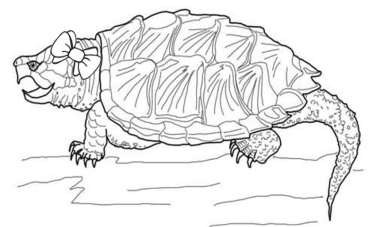
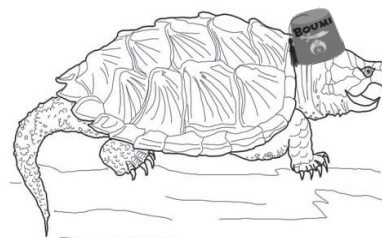
"Well, just make sure that Homero guy doesn't get any ideas."

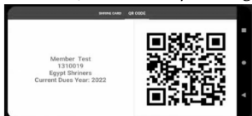
